Tests: There will be four unit tests given over the course of the semester, each worth 140 points. They will be given at the end of Chapters $7,10,11$, and 12 . There will also be a 250 -point comprehensive final. The tests will be over the material in the homework problem sets and class lectures. Each test after the first will include a question from an earlier test.

Homework: The plans are to have online homework problems over most sections through software called WebWork. WebWork problems may be repeated up to 5 times to improve your score. Supplementary homework assignments from the textbook will be handed out over each test block. These textbook assignments with be monitored by having occasional 30-point notebook-open quizzes the last 20 minutes of some weekly class. Homework will consist of a combination of web-based problems using WebWork and problems assigned from the text.

Grades: Your homework score, unit test scores, and final score will be added at the end of the semester. Grades will be assigned on a cumulative semester basis.
Homework: Webwork and Quiz scores combined and scaled to give 200 possible total points: $88 \%-100 \%(A), 76 \%-88 \%(B), 64 \%-76 \%(C), 52 \%-64 \%(D)$.
