Friday, June 18th - The LCROSS (Lunar Crater Observation and Sensing Satellite) was sent to the moon for one purpose: to find water. Many people awoke at the wee hours of October 9th, 2009 to watch the explosive culmination of the LCROSS mission when the Centaur impacted the moon inside a permanently shadowed region at the south pole. Since the impact, much data has been recovered and analyzed. On Friday, June 18th, a speaker the Highland Road Park Observatory will discuss the latest findings of the LCROSS mission, as well as some history of the mission. Following the lecture, the observatory staff will open the 20 inch telescope for astronomical viewing.

Saturday, June 19th - The part of the Tunica Hills that we will hike is called Clark Creek Natural Area. It takes a little more than an hour to drive to the trailhead.

It is located north of Baton Rouge just over the Mississippi border. There are 6 waterfalls ranging from 10 to more than 25 feet in height.

"The terrain at Clark Creek is physically demanding and visitors should be medically fit before going afield. Be certain to be careful. WATCH YOUR FOOTING ALONG STEEP TRAILS

AND AROUND THE WATERFALLS!" A day permit is required; it costs \$3. The Nature Area has a mix of hardwood and pine forest with large beech and magnolia trees.

The park includes migratory birds, poisonous snakes, a rare land snail, white-tail deer, the Southern red belly dace (a state endangered fish), fox, squirrel

as well as the black bear. The park has both primitive and improved trails. The improved trails have been paved with pea gravel and include steep wooden stairs.

Clark Creek's steeply sloping bluffs increase the difficulty of hiking. The length of the primitive trail is approximately 2.6 miles (4.2 km) and

usually takes 3-5 hours to complete. The improved trails are approximately 1.75 miles

(2.82 km) long and usually take around 2 hours to complete. Bring your own water and insect repellant. We will leave LSU at 8am.

Geocaching is a worldwide game of hiding and seeking treasure. A geocacher can place a geocache in the world, pinpoint its location using GPS technology and then share the geocache's existence and location online. Anyone with a GPS device or GPS enabled smart phone can then try to locate the geocache. There are more than 500 geocaches hidden in Baton Rouge alone. During the summer, the twilight hours are the best for geocaching due to the heat of the day, and that is exactly the time we will be using in our quest for caches.

Wednesday, June 23rd - Poetry Night. Participants will be given two words with which to construct their poem. Will then break into two teams. Team A gives Team B a word and they are to construct their poem, and then it will switch.
